ORDER OF BUSINESS

REGULAR MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of North Augusta of November 21, 2022 having been duly publicized was called to order by Mayor Williams at 6:00pm and also streamed online for public viewing at "City of North Augusta – Public Information" on www.Facebook.com and on the City YouTube page: "City of North Augusta Public Information" then adjourned at 6:19pm Per Section 30-4-80, (e) notice of the meeting by email was sent out to the current maintained "Agenda Mailout" list consisting of news media outlets and individuals or companies requesting notification. ITEM 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of November 7, 2022 and Study Session of November 14, 2022, were approved by general consent.

ITEM 5. PERSONNEL: George Williams, Retirement – Recognition of Service to the City of North Augusta:

ARBOR DAY PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, the holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, lower our heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products; and

WHEREAS, trees in our City increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Briton S. Williams, Mayor of the City of North Augusta, South Carolina, do hereby proclaim December 2, 2022, as "**Arbor Day**" in North Augusta, South Carolina, and urge all citizens to celebrate Arbor Day and to support efforts to protect our trees and woodlands, and further, I urge all citizens to plant and care for trees to gladden the heart and promote the well-being of this and future generations.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-53

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURE OF CORONAVIRUS STATE AND LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS – EXPENDITURE REQUEST 4

WHEREAS, on July 19, 2021, City Council adopted Resolution 2021-30 authorizing receipt of the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) allocation totaling \$11,871,089.22 from the State of South Carolina as appropriated by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution 2022-12, which obligated SLFRF funds for use between revenue loss replacement and investment in water and sewer infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution 2022-13, which authorized Expenditure Request 1 totaling \$3,965,004 for two projects; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution 2022-28, which authorized Expenditure Request 2 totaling \$3,123,632 for one project; and

WHEREAS, City Council adopted Resolution 2022-35, which authorized Expenditure Request 3 totaling \$1,367,000 for six projects; and

WHEREAS, expenditure of SLFRF funds are required to be approved by City Council via resolution; and

WHEREAS, four new projects have been identified and recommended for expenditure totaling \$1,600,000 as outlined in Appendix A; and

WHEREAS, with these additional expenditures, \$1,815,452 remains of available SLFRF funds for future expenditures.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Augusta, South Carolina, in a meeting duly assembled and by the authority thereof, that:

- 1. Expenditures of \$1,600,000 of SLFRF funds is approved for the projects listed in Appendix A.
- 2. The City will follow its adopted procurement ordinance as it relates to expenditure of SLFRF funds.
- 3. The City Administrator is authorized to execute such documents as necessary to enter into agreements and implement the projects as outlined in Appendix A.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-54

AUTHORIZING A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH SATTERFIELD CONSTRUCTION CO., INC. FOR THE POLE BRANCH WATERSHED REMEDIATION PROJECT AND ESTABLISHING THE FUNDING SOURCE FOR RELATED CONSTRUCTION EXPENSES

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2022-001, City Council accepted an Emergency Watershed Protection Program grant from the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) for the Pole Branch Watershed Remediation; and

WHEREAS, the grant will reimburse 75% of eligible construction costs, up to a maximum of \$2,047,500.00.

WHEREAS, engineering design and permitting have been completed and the project has been approved for construction by the NRCS; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the best opportunity to construct this sewer extension is during construction of Rushing Waters, Phase 3; and

WHEREAS, a proposal has been received from the on-site contractor, Satterfield Construction Co., Inc. (SCC) to perform the remediation work, in accordance with the plans and specifications prepared by Cranston Engineering, for the amount of \$721,786.99; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to procure and furnish materials to SCC at an estimated cost of \$753,000.00; and

WHEREAS, other construction-related costs bring the total estimated project cost to \$1,560,000.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of North Augusta, South Carolina, in meeting duly assembled and by the authority thereof that Satterfield Construction Co., Inc. shall be awarded the contract for the Pole Branch Remediation Project for the amount of \$721,786.99.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funding source for the City's obligation for this project shall be from the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) up to a maximum of \$400,000.00, in addition to any in-kind services that the City is able to provide.
