3. Discuss Court Cases

Mr. Paradise stated the next topic is discussion of court cases. They went over a case that was against City of North Augusta and Board of Zoning Appeals. This was for a fireworks and Halloween store. The neighborhood came out and spoke against it. The BZA was against it, but then it got an appeal and went to circuit court. The result was a fireworks store and costing the city about \$30,000. They also discussed another case in Anderson County.
