MINUTES OF JANUARY 18, 2023

ORDER OF BUSINESS

The Municipal Election Commission meeting of January 18, 2023, having been duly publicized, was called to order by Chairperson Ben Watson at 2:00 p.m. in the Conference Room on the third floor of the Municipal Center.

Per Section 30-4-80(e) notice of the meeting was posted on the outside doors of the Municipal Center, the main bulletin board of the Municipal Center located on the first floor, and the City of North Augusta website.

Present were Commissioners Carleton Vaughn and Ben Watson. Also in attendance was Kevin Whaley, GIS Analyst, and Jamie Paul, City Clerk.

ITEM 3: Approval of Minutes of November 29, 2022

The minutes of the Municipal Election Commission of November 29, 2022, were approved as submitted by general consent.

ITEM 4: Review General Election Timeline

Commissioners, GIS Analyst, and City Clerk discussed the General Election timeline in detail. (See Attachment #4)

Commissioner Vaughn stated he has a conflict with the February 22, 2023 meeting date.

Commissioners discussed and agreed upon the next meeting date to be January 31, 2023.

ITEM 5: Review Ordinance to Partner with the Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections to Conduct a Portion of the 2023 City of North Augusta Municipal General Election - Ordinance No. 2022-20

Commissioners reviewed the adopted Ordinance to Partner with the Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections to Conduct a Portion of the 2023 City of North Augusta Municipal General Election, Ordinance No. 2022-20. (See Attachment #5)

ITEM 6: Finalize General Election Public Notice

City Clerk Paul explained that polling location Our Lady of Peace Annex is unable to be a polling location for North Augusta precinct #54. She asked for assistance on nearby locations that could be a potential polling location. She added that a potential early voting location may be considered in the city, however, there is an additional cost and the city would need to confirm a location. She clarified that early voting will take place at Aiken County Registration & Elections Commission in Aiken and the Edgefield County Registration & Elections Commission in Edgefield for North Augusta residents that are within the city limits in Edgefield County

Discussion ensued relating to polling location options and early voting timeframes.

Clerk Paul recommended to the Commission that item #6 be tabled in order to confirm a polling place and if early voting in the city is possible.

It was moved by Commissioner Vaughn, seconded by Chairman Watson, to table the finalization of the General Election Public Notice to the next meeting on January 31, 2023. Unanimously Approved.

ITEM 7: Next Steps

GIS Analyst Kevin Whaley briefly updated the commission on the tabulating process on election night. He clarified he would need the candidates names and precincts to setup the system. Clerk Paul clarified that she is still waiting to hear from the Democratic party on their certification of candidates.

Commissioners and staff discussed precinct signs and signage at polling locations.

ITEM 8: Adjournment

There being no further business, the commission adjourned the meeting at 2:48 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-20 AN ORDINANCE TO PARTNER WITH THE AIKEN COUNTY BOARD OF REGISTRATION AND ELECTIONS TO CONDUCT A PORTION OF THE 2023 CITY OF NORTH AUGUSTA MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Laws of South Carolina, and Ordinance No. 2022-16 adopted October 17, 2022, the City of North Augusta will hold an election on April 25, 2023 to elect three City Council Members; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to partner with the Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections to conduct a portion of the election; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH AUGUSTA, SOUTH CAROLINA, IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED AND BY THE AUTHORITY THEREOF, THAT:

- I. The City Administrator is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections. Under the terms of the agreement, the Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections will provide:
 - a. Staffing of polling locations on Election Day, Tuesday, April 25, 2023
 - b. Delivery, set-up, maintenance, and removal of voting machines
 - c. Absentee and provisional ballots; seals, forms, and supplies
 - d. Poll workers and support staff
- II. The Aiken County Board of Registration and Elections has estimated the election costs and expenses to be \$9424.69, see Exhibit A.
- III. The Council approves payment of this amount from the City Council Professional Services account.
- IV. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption on second reading.
