

ORDER OF BUSINESS

The Municipal Election Commission meeting of January 31, 2023, having been duly publicized, was called to order by Chairperson Ben Watson at 2:00 p.m. in the Conference Room on the third floor of the Municipal Center.

Per Section 30-4-80(e) notice of the meeting was posted on the outside doors of the Municipal Center, the main bulletin board of the Municipal Center located on the first floor, and the City of North Augusta website.

Present were Commissioners Alphia Dunbar, Carleton Vaughn, and Ben Watson. Also in attendance was Kevin Whaley, GIS Analyst, and Jamie Paul, City Clerk.

ITEM 3: Approval of Minutes of January 18, 2023

The minutes of the Municipal Election Commission of January 18, 2023, were approved as submitted by general consent.

ITEM 4: Oath of Office for New Appointee

Clerk Paul swore in new Commissioner Alphia Dunbar.

ITEM 5: Discussion of Training Requirements

Clerk Paul stated that training for the MEC is completed online and will reach out to Cynthia Holland, Aiken County Registration & Elections Director to provide her with her login

information. She added that each commissioner should refresh themselves as well prior to election day.

ITEM 6: Finalize General Election Public Notice – Tabled from January 18, 2023 meeting

Clerk Paul clarified that the item will need to be removed from the table to discuss and possibly approve. She added that Commissioner Dunbar would abstain from the vote as she was not a Commissioner at the January 18, 2023 meeting.

It was moved by Chairman Watson, seconded by Commissioner Vaughn, to remove item #6 from the table from the January 18, 2023 meeting to discuss and possibly approve the finalization of the General Election Public Notice. Approved 2-0. Commissioner Dunbar abstained.

Clerk Paul confirmed that for North Augusta 54 Precinct the polling location will be at the North Augusta Middle School. The Commissioners reviewed the General Election Public Notice.

It was moved by Commissioner Vaughn, seconded by Commissioner Dunbar to approve the General Election Public Notice as presented. Unanimously Approved. (See Attachment #6)

ITEM 7: Overview of Tabulating Votes on Election Night – by Kevin Whaley, GIS Analyst

GIS Analyst Kevin Whaley presented the tabulating process on election night and showed how the unofficial number of votes will be shown live.

ITEM 8: Review Certified Candidates from Democratic and Republican Parties

Chairman Watson confirmed that the commission has received the certification letter from the Democratic and Republican parties. The following candidates were certified:

Democratic Party: Richard Adams, Councilmember

Republican Party: David B. Buck, Councilmember; Eric H. Presnell, Councilmember; and Kevin W. Toole, Councilmember

ITEM 9: Approve and Sign Certification Letter to Council

Commissioners reviewed the certification letter to be provided to Mayor and Council and approved the letter by general consensus. (See Attachment #9)

ITEM 10: Review General Election Timeline

Commissioners, GIS Analyst, and City Clerk discussed the General Election timeline in detail. (See Attachment #10)

ITEM 11: Next Steps

Commissioners, GIS Analyst, and City Clerk discussed election night process, receiving the unofficial tape totals from Aiken and Edgefield Counties for the early voting totals, and precinct signs to potentially be posted outside of polling place. Clerk Paul stated she will contact both counties to setup a process to receive vote total tapes on election night.

ITEM 12: Next Meeting Date

Commissioners discussed meeting before the April 12, 2023 MEC meeting and agreed upon meeting on Tuesday, March 14, 2023.

ITEM 13: Adjournment

There being no further business, the commission adjourned the meeting at 2:54 p.m.
