CITY COUNCIL PURCHASES LAND FOR MUNICIPAL COMPLEX

In October the City Council formally decided to purchase 1.8 acres of land from North Augusta 2000 to locate a new municipal administration and service complex. The land is located south of Bluff Avenue between Georgia Avenue and the planned extension of Georgia Avenue into the North Augusta Riverfront and Hammond's Ferry. The newly acquired property is adjacent to a 0.6 acre parcel the city purchased a number of years ago. The combined 2.4 acre site is more than adequate for a state of the art municipal complex.

The City Council selected the site because of its visibility and accessibility upon the recommendation of The Boudreaux Group, the Columbia, South Carolina, based architecture firm hired by the city in 2003. To date The Boudreaux Group has completed a space needs analysis and the site selection evaluation and has started on the design of the complex. Boudreaux will also provide project construction supervision. Funding for the \$448,678 purchase was budgeted in the city's Riverfront/Central Core Redevelopment fund.

North Augusta 2000 is a non-profit community foundation established to promote community improvement in North Augusta. As part of its mission North Augusta 2000 created a public purpose land bank to acquire critical redevelopment and environmentally sensitive properties. Properties acquired for redevelopment purposes may be sold to the city for public projects or to private interests for desired redevelopment projects. Proceeds from the sale of land are used by North Augusta 2000 for the acquisition of additional redevelopment land.

2006 CITY BUDGET _____ ADOPTED _____

The 2006 Consolidated Municipal Budget totaling \$25,290,541 was approved by the City Council on November 21, 2005. The city's mill levy for 2006 (2005 tax year) is 81.08, unchanged from 2005. In 2006, 72.13 mills will be collected for the General Fund and 8.95 for the Capital Projects Fund.

BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS

Calendar year 2006 business license renewal applications will be distributed to current licensees during the last week of December. Completed applications are due back to the Finance Department no later than February 1, 2006. A delinquent payment penalty of ten percent will be added to any application received after February 1. The penalty will increase by five percent each month until received.

Business licensees should carefully examine the information on the application to confirm that it is correct. Corrections or additions should be written directly on the application form. Once properly completed and signed, the application should be returned to the city with the correct fee. Turn around time on a properly completed business license application is usually within ten days.

WINTER BASE PERIOD IN EFFECT

The City of North Augusta uses a "Winter Base Sewer Rate System" for calculating sewer service charges. Three months of actual water usage are used to calculate sewer charges for the remaining nine months of the year. The three month base period covers the three water meter readings taken between December 10 and March 9. Water meter readings are based on the actual water usage for the month preceding the reading.

Each utility customer is billed a sewer service charge based on actual water consumption during the three winter base months. The average consumption of these three months is then used for the remaining nine billing periods of the year. New customers with no winter base history are charged an amount equal to the average of all residential sewer customers. For more information about the Winter Base Period, please call 803-441-4212.

TAX NOTICES

Tax notices on real and personal property and on merchants' inventory for the 2005 tax year will be mailed to property owners in January. Tax payments are due by May 1, 2006. For those property owners whose taxes are escrowed by a mortgage company, tax notices will be mailed directly to the mortgage company.

GREENEWAY TRAIL RECEIVES STATE AND _____NATIONAL RECOGNITION____

North Augusta's Greeneway Trail received significant recognition in 2005. In November, the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR) recognized the Greeneway with its 2005 Stewardship Development Award. The Stewardship Development Award recognizes projects that demonstrate thoughtful stewardship of the environment through careful planning and construction.

In announcing the award, SCDNR Land, Water & Conservation Division Deputy Director Freddy Vang commended North Augusta's livability and its leaders' plan for future growth. According to Vang, "Their foresight and dedication is admirable, and should serve as a model for other municipalities as they plan for their futures. The Greeneway is just one example of that dedication."

In June, the United States Department of the Interior designated the Greeneway a National Recreation Trail, one of only 37 such trails in the country receiving the designation in 2005. The goal of the National Recreation Trail Program is to promote the use and care of

The section of the Greeneway that was closed for most of the summer, between Riverside Boulevard (Georgia Avenue tunnel) and Hammond's Ferry Road, has been reopened to Greeneway users. The Greeneway was closed to relocate a major water line and construct the extension of Crystal Lake Drive into the Hammond's Ferry development. A new Greeneway pedestrian bridge, a smaller version of the bridge over Martintown Road, now crosses the Crystal Drive extension.

existing trails and stimulate the development of new trails to create a national network. To date, over 900 public use trails ranging from less than a mile to 485 miles in length and located on federal, state, municipal and private land, have been included in the National Recreation Trail system.

According to a Department of the Interior press release, "National Recreation Trail designation is an honor given to existing trails that have been nominated and meet the requirements for connecting people to local resources and improving their quality of life. The national trail designation is part of a continuing campaign to promote community partnerships and to foster innovative ways to encourage physical fitness."

GREENEWAY RULES

The Greeneway Trail system is one of North Augusta's most popular recreational amenities. It was designed for recreation use only and is fully accessible to the public.

In response to recent citizen concerns and in an effort to ensure the continued safe and enjoyable use of the Greeneway, the City Council adopted rules and regulations for the use of the trail.

The following list is a summary of the rules. A copy of the resolution containing the complete list of Greeneway rules and regulations is available online at *www.northaugusta.net*.

GENERAL GREENEWAY RULES

- Travel in a consistent and predictable manner.
- Keep right and pass left.
- Pedestrians have the right of way.
- Walk no more than two abreast.
- Give an audible warning at least two seconds before passing.
- State law requires bells on bicycles and helmets on all riders 14 and younger.
- Pets must be on a leash and pet waste must be collected and deposited in an appropriate receptacle.
- Leave No Trace: Take out what you take in.
