BUNTING PARK

In accordance with the city's Parks and Recreation Master Plan, the neighborhood park recently received a substantial renovation and face-lift that included drainage improvements, new playground equipment, a picnic shelter and landscaping.

2005 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

The city will implement a number of major improvement projects in 2005. Some are already under construction. Others will be started in 2005.

WALNUT LANE GREENEWAY EXTENSION

A contract was recently awarded to construct a mile long Greeneway Extension along Walnut Lane. To be constructed this spring, the 10 foot wide trail will provide pedestrian and bicycle access between the Butler's Mill and Walnut Grove subdivisions. It will intersect with the boardwalk connection to Walnut Lane Neighborhood Park that currently terminates on Walnut Lane across from Cherry Laurel Drive, the entrance to Arbor Place. The North Augusta Bikeway System plan calls for the eventual connection of the Walnut Lane Greeneway extension with a new section of the Greeneway from Pisgah Road to Walnut Lane.

RIVERFRONT GREENEWAY EXTENSION

Construction continues on a 1.5 mile extension of the Greeneway Trail into the North Augusta riverfront. The existing Greeneway corridor will be linked with the Savannah River, the riverfront park in the Hammond's Ferry community, and loop back to the Greeneway at Riverside Boulevard. 2005 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS continued

County Capital Projects Sales Tax and grants from the Land and Water Conservation Fund through the South Carolina Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism, and from the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources. Work should be complete so the new Greeneway segment can be opened to traffic in April.

ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Reconstruction work is underway on 0.85 miles of older city streets. The \$960,000 sales tax funded project includes the installation of curb, gutter and storm drains, resurfacing and, in some cases, the construction of sidewalks. The anticipated completion date is July 2005. Streets to be reconstructed are:

SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION

A \$753,000 portion of the first round of the Capital Projects Sales Tax was earmarked to construct new city sidewalks to improve pedestrian safety and accessibility. Approximately 3.25 miles of sidewalks will be installed by July. The new sidewalks will be located adjacent to schools, parks and other public facilities, and along major roads where needed to connect existing sidewalks. Additional sidewalk construction over the next few years is scheduled for funding with proceeds from the second round of the Capital Projects Sales Tax. HAMMOND'S FERRY SOCCER COMPLEX

Construction of the Hammond's Ferry Soccer Complex will begin soon. The complex will be located across Hammond's Ferry Road from the city's water treatment plant and an existing soccer field. In accordance with the city's Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan, it will include one championship size and two smaller soccer fields, parking, restrooms and a covered picnic pavilion. Major improvements to Hammond's Ferry Road from Georgetown Drive to the city's boat ramp will also be completed as part of the project. The \$1.2 million project is being funded by a combination of Capital Projects Sales Tax receipts and a grant from the National Parks Service Land and Water Conservation Fund through the South Carolina Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism.

DOWNTOWN STREETSCAPE, PHASE 2

Construction will begin in August on the second phase of the downtown streetscape. Improvements to Georgia Avenue several years ago constituted Phase 1. The second phase includes the reconstruction of West Avenue between Jackson and Clifton Avenues, and Jackson, Spring Grove, Pine Grove and Buena Vista Avenues between West and Georgia Avenues.

Improvements will include wider sidewalks and a wider landscape strip between the sidewalk and the curb. Additionally, stamped crosswalks, street trees and decorative streetlights will be installed. Overhead utility lines will be removed. The design will also narrow the roadway to calm traffic. On-street parking will remain on both sides of the street. Construction is expected to be complete in early 2006.

The \$1.8 million project is being funded in part by Capital Project Sales Tax receipts. Other funding is being provided through the city's Capital Projects Fund, the city's franchise agreement with South Carolina Electric & Gas and by the South Carolina Department of Transportation through the Transportation Enhancement program.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO BE

The city is in the process of updating its Comprehensive Plan. State law requires local governments to maintain an up to date plan for the growth and development of the community. The plan must be reviewed at least every five years and updated every 10 years. The city's current plan was adopted in 1995 and partially updated in late 1999. City staff has been drafting the new plan based on information produced by the 2000 census and policies developed by the City Council and Planning Commission over the last six years. The plan serves as the basis for the city's zoning and development regulations.

The state law also requires that the plan address at least seven areas – population, housing, economic development, community facilities and services, cultural resources, natural resources and land use. The North Augusta plan also addresses transportation as a separate element. The plan must include an inventory and assessment of current conditions, conclusions, goals, objectives and implementation strategies for long range improvement projects.

CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION

April 11, 2006, will mark the 100 year anniversary of the incorporation of North Augusta. On December 6, 2004, the City Council appointed a Centennial Celebration Steering Committee to plan for and oversee the implementation of a grand centennial celebration next year. Jack Alexander, Angela Burkhalter, Pat Carpenter, Harley Drew, Tom Greene, Victoria Hann, John Hexamer, Shirley Holgate, Henry Jones, Lark Jones, Rev. David Thompson, Mim Woodring and Kelly Zier make up the committee. The committee held its first meeting last month at the North Augusta Community Center and established the theme for the year-long celebration, "Celebrating a Century of Excellence."

CENTENNIAL PUBLIC MEETING PLANNED – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

A public meeting to solicit input and support for the 2006 Centennial Celebration will be held Tuesday, March 15, at 6:30 p.m. at the North Augusta Community Center. Those interested in volunteering, sponsoring or assisting in any capacity are encouraged to attend the meeting or call 441-4224. Centennial celebration plans will be posted on the city website, *www.northaugusta.net*, as soon as they are available. The Planning Commission has reviewed portions of the proposed plan in several study sessions. It is anticipated that the 2005 Comprehensive Plan will be considered in its final form by the Planning Commission in February and by the City Council in March.

GROWTH CONCLUSIONS

- The city's population growth rate has been relatively steady at approximately 1.4 to 1.5 percent per year between 1990 and 2000; however, indications are that it is increasing.
- Residential development activity has varied between 90 and 100 lots per year through 2000 but is now averaging 150 to 160 lots per year.
- Since 1980 North Augusta's population has grown by 36.9%.
- Since 1980 North Augusta's land area has grown by 138.4%.

- TOGETHER Aiken County

Together Aiken County is a project to create a long-term vision and plan for the entire community of Aiken County through input from residents. A series of public meetings are currently being held to collect ideas about the future of the county. Future meetings will be held to develop shared goals for the future and ways to turn those goals into reality. Finally, open house sessions will be offered to allow Aiken County residents the opportunity to review the progress of the strategic planning efforts, identify priority goals and volunteer to help in getting things started to reach the goals.
