


Betula nigra 'BNMTF' 'Dura-Heat' River Birch



Category: Deciduous, broadleaf, large tree

Hardiness: Zone 4-9

Foliage: Medium to dark green, serrated leaves turning yellow in the fall

Bark: Smooth; greenish brown when young; mature exfoliates in large paper sheets with gray brown to chalky tan to beige color

Shape: Upright, open oval, can be multi stem or single stem

Mature Size: 40-50ft tall 25-35ft wide

Growth Rate: Moderate to fast

Shade: Full Sun to partial shade

Adaptability: Well drained, moist , fertile humus rich soil , very tolerant of moist soil

Native Habitat: Eastern central United States through the South and into Eastern Texas; cultivar of nursey origin.

Uses: Specimen tree, urban areas as a street tree or in medians, lawns, and parks
