

Quercus bicolor Swamp White Oak



Category: Large deciduous tree

Hardiness: Zone 3-8

Foliage: Lustrous dark green leaves covered with white pubescence beneath. Fall color is yellowish - brown, but occasionally russet- red

Bark: Brownish-black bark is rough & scaly, becoming deeply ridged and furrowed with age

Shape: Stiffly Pyramidal in youth, irregular to rounded at maturity

Mature Size: 50-60ft tall 50-60ft wide

Growth Rate: Fast

Shade: Full Sun; tolerates part shade

Adaptability: Plant in moist acid soils, worthy choice for wet areas

Native Habitat: Quebec to Michigan, south to Georgia and Arkansas

Uses: Naturalizing areas, in parks, golf courses and in large areas, bottomlands, and swamps.
