Foliage: Glossy Dark green

Blooms: White ,lightly fragrant flowers, strap-like petals 6-8 inch long that open on previous years wood; during April - May

Bark: Gray, and with maturity becomes ridged and

furrowed.

Winter color: yellow fall color and drop late often in

December in southern climates

Shape: Upright, rounded & spreading

Mature Size: 12-20ft tall by 12-20ft wide

Growth Rate: Slow to moderate

Shade: Full Sun to part shade

Adaptability: Prefers moist, acid, well drained soils

Native Habitat: Southeastern United States; Sothern

New Jersey, to Florida, west to Texas

Uses: Specimen tree, small shade tree; a good

substitute for Cornus and Prunus
