

Cercis canadensis Eastern Redbud



Category: Deciduous small flowering tree

Hardiness: Zone 4-9

Foliage: Heart shaped leaves medium to dark green leaves that turn yellow in the fall

Blooms: Lavender-purple or pink blooms in early spring before the leaves emerge

Bark: Smooth; thin, brownish gray to black bark

Shape: Irregular, upright, rounded, vase-shaped.

Mature Size: 20-30ft tall by 15-25ft wide

Growth Rate: Moderate to Fast

Shade: Part shade to Full Sun, flowers best in full sun

Adaptability: Well drained moist fertile humus soil, well limed, sandy, clay or loam soil that is well drained. Not tolerant of flooded soil or compacted soil.

Native Habitat: Throughout Eastern United States, from the Northeast to Florida , along the Gulf Coast to Texas and into Northern Mexico

Uses: Specimen tree, containers, flowering native tree, naturalizing & group plantings
