

Quercus nuttallii Nuttall Oak



Category: Deciduous, broadleaf, large tree

Hardiness: Zone 6b-8

Foliage: Alternate, simple, coarsely lobed, new growth emerges reddish and mature to a dull dark green leaves, turns orange scarlet in the fall

Bark: Dark, gray-brown; divided into scaly rigid plates

and broken by shallow furrows.

Shape: Round crown

Mature Size: 60-80ft tall 35-50ft wide

Growth Rate: Moderate

Shade: Full Sun tolerates part shade

Adaptability: Well drained moist fertile, humus rich, slightly acidic growing in areas where there is

frequent flooding.

Native Habitat: From Eastern United States to coastal to Minnesota down through Arkansas and

into Texas

Uses: Eastern united states to southwestern Illinois and along the Mississippi River to Louisiana
