


Carya illinoinensis Pecan



Category: Deciduous, broadleaf, large tree

Hardiness: Zone 5-9

Foliage: Lustrous dark olive-green leaves, no

appreciable fall color

Bark: Dark, gray-brown; divided into scaly rigid plates

and broken by shallow furrows.

Shape: Oval crown

Mature Size: 70-100ft tall 40-75ft wide

Growth Rate: Medium rate 13-24inches per year

Shade: Full Sun

Adaptability: Difficult to transplant—a 6ft. tree may have 4ft. tap root. Best growth in deep moist, well-

drained soil.

Native Habitat: River valleys throughout its native range of Indiana, to Iowa, south to Alabama, Texas,

and Mexico

Uses: Multimillion dollar industry in the united states with the production of pecans, limited use in the average landscape due to its size.
