

Ulmus americana 'Princeton' Princeton American Elm



Native shade tree - own root. This older American Elm introduction with large leathery foliage, is vigorous and resistant to Elm Leaf Beetle and Dutch Elm Disease. Selected by William Flemer Sr. for its rapid growth, vase habit, and disease resistance.
