## Topping Out CEREMONY HELD

On January 22 city officials gathered at the site of the new municipal center for an official topping out ceremony. Topping out is a traditional ceremony commemorating the erection of the last structural steel beam at the top of the building. An American flag was raised on the building after it reached its full height.

The gathering included members of the construction crew of M.B. Kahn Construction Company, representatives of the architectural firm, The Boudreaux Group, Aiken County officials and members of the community. After the ceremony, a barbeque luncheon was held at the North Augusta Community Center.

Construction of the new municipal center started in July 2007 and is expected to be complete in early 2009.



### Greater Downtown Area — MASTER PLAN —

The City of North Augusta has entered into a partnership with Augusta Tomorrow and the City of Augusta to develop a Greater Downtown Area Master Plan that will span the Savannah River.

The greater downtown planning area includes the riverfront and downtown areas of the City of North Augusta and the city center area of Augusta including the adjoining neighborhoods, the medical facilities area, and the canal and river corridors. Once implemented, the new plan will guide growth and development in the planning area for the next 25 years.

As a private corporation with representation from the City of Augusta and the City of North Augusta, Augusta Tomorrow has identified development and redevelopment needs and actively worked with developers and the public sector to implement downtown development projects since 1982. Augusta Tomorrow was created as a public private partnership with the City of Augusta to develop a master plan for Augusta's downtown. That plan is now substantially complete and has resulted in the development of Augusta's Riverwalk promenade, the Augusta Riverfront Hotel & Convention Center, the Riverfront Office Center and the Augusta Common.

In looking to the future, Augusta Tomorrow has expanded its vision. The new plan will provide a unique opportunity for Augusta and North Augusta to work together to improve commerce, culture and urban life for all portions of both communities on both sides of the river.

Because North Augusta and downtown Augusta are so close geographically, separated by only a state line and the Savannah River, what happens on one side of the river impacts the other. By combining efforts and generating a master plan for growth that includes both communities, the area as a whole will benefit.

A Request for Qualifications from professional planning firms was published in October 2007 and the process of selecting a firm to develop the plan has begun. After a firm is selected, development of the plan will take about a year. The planning process will include a series of public forums in Augusta and North Augusta to seek input from citizens. The public meetings will be extensive. All interested residents of North Augusta and Augusta will be encouraged to attend and share ideas for a better downtown and a better community. The end result of the process will be a plan that prioritizes sustainable initiatives for economic development coupled with activities and projects that are important to the two communities and their residents.

The estimated cost for developing the plan is \$250,000. Half of the funding, \$125,000 will come from private donations. The City of Augusta will contribute \$94,000 and the City of North Augusta will contribute \$31,000.
