According to the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA), governments need to amend their budgets to respond to changing conditions, needs, and priorities. A budget is a plan, but it's not static, and governments must be able to adjust it to serve their residents.

- New Revenue Line item for FEMA Reimbursement
- The 2024 Budget will need to be amended to reflect these changes and to serve as a tool to monitor expenses with expected reimbursements.

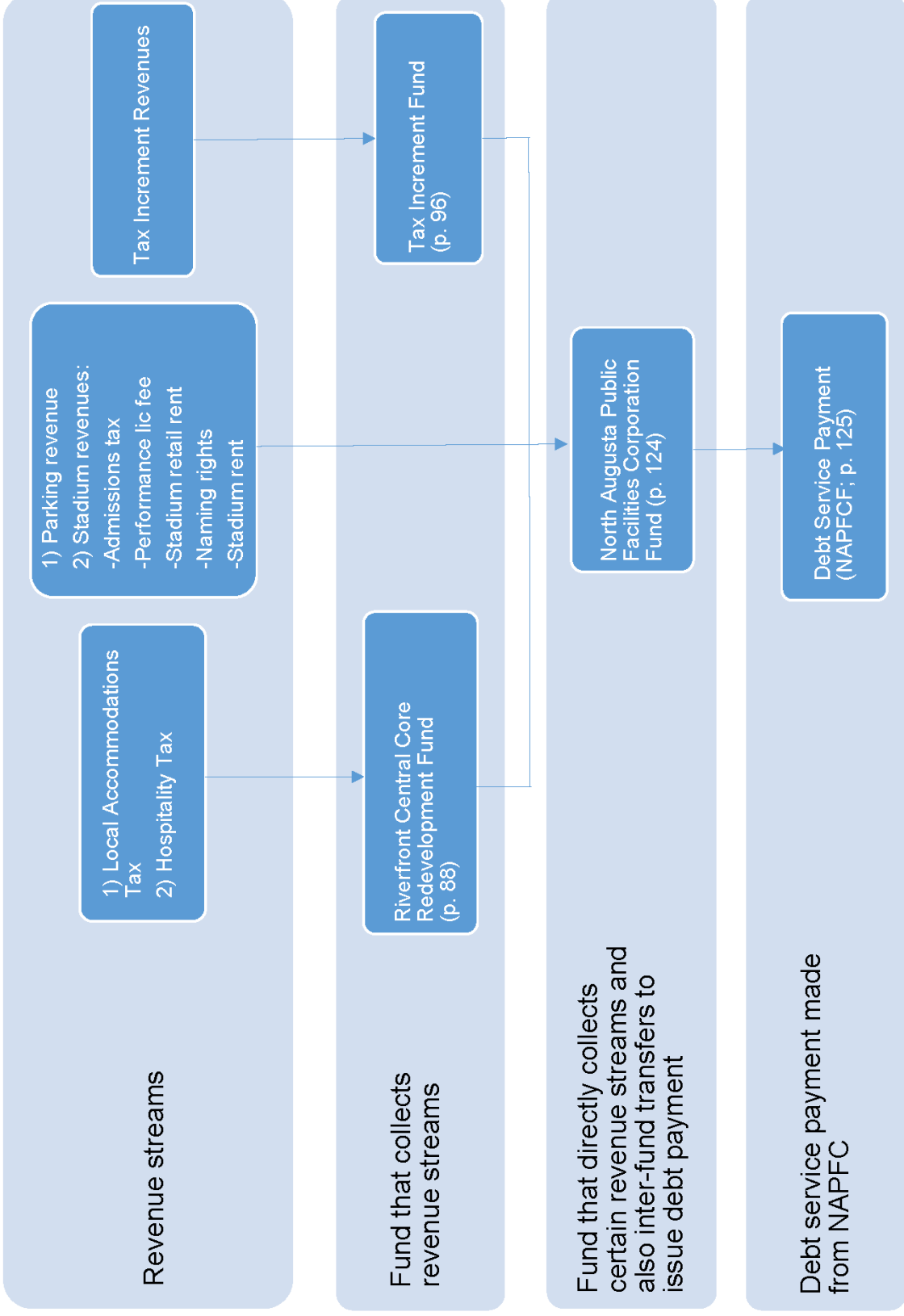
Changes to Financial Transparency

- Instituted under previous mayor to show the public who the City was paying and how much they were receiving.
- Financial fraud is on the rise in the CSRA and the City has been the victim of several fraud attempts over the past year.
- The information we provide on the City's transparency page is assisting in the financial fraud attempts.

Potential Addendum to Base Budget

The City received late-breaking news Public Safety was approved for a COPS grant

- Partially funds three PSOs, a portion of salary only
- Salary cost factors on the General Fund if we start the COPS grant on July 1, 2025:
 - 2025 \$10,995.
 - 2026 \$96,990
 - 2027 \$209,490
 - 2028 \$259,490.
- No funding mechanism in general fund for vehicles, equipment, and salary
- ARPA is still an open funding line, and we have the ability to fund vehicles and equipment
- Adding one more vehicle to ARPA funding opens up budget for salary
- Possible to add three officers with no impact to the general fund in 2025; likely impacts in 2026 and beyond

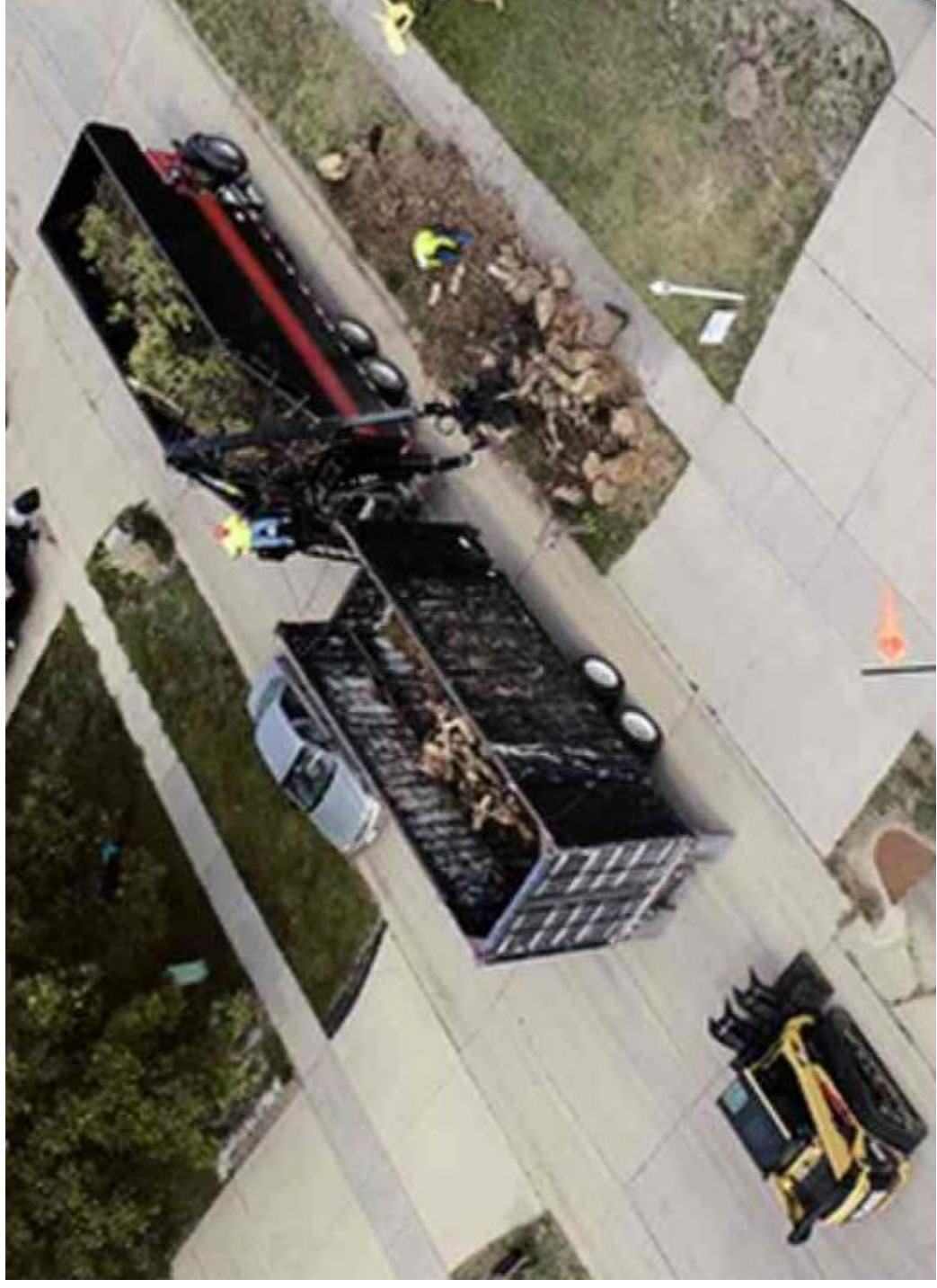


City Yard Debris Truck

- City Limits only (Belvedere covered by Aiken County)
- Suspend normal yard debris routes for at least 90 days
- Dedicate two full crews to debris removal mission on City streets
- Voluntary overtime for city debris crews
- Err on side of caution for use of City trucks- don't risk vehicle breakdowns in an attempt to pick up large/heavy debris
- Roads are a priority over the Greenway
- We will only pull trucks off assigned missions for Life/Health/Safety
- **Goal is to achieve as close to 100% FEMA reimbursement as possible**

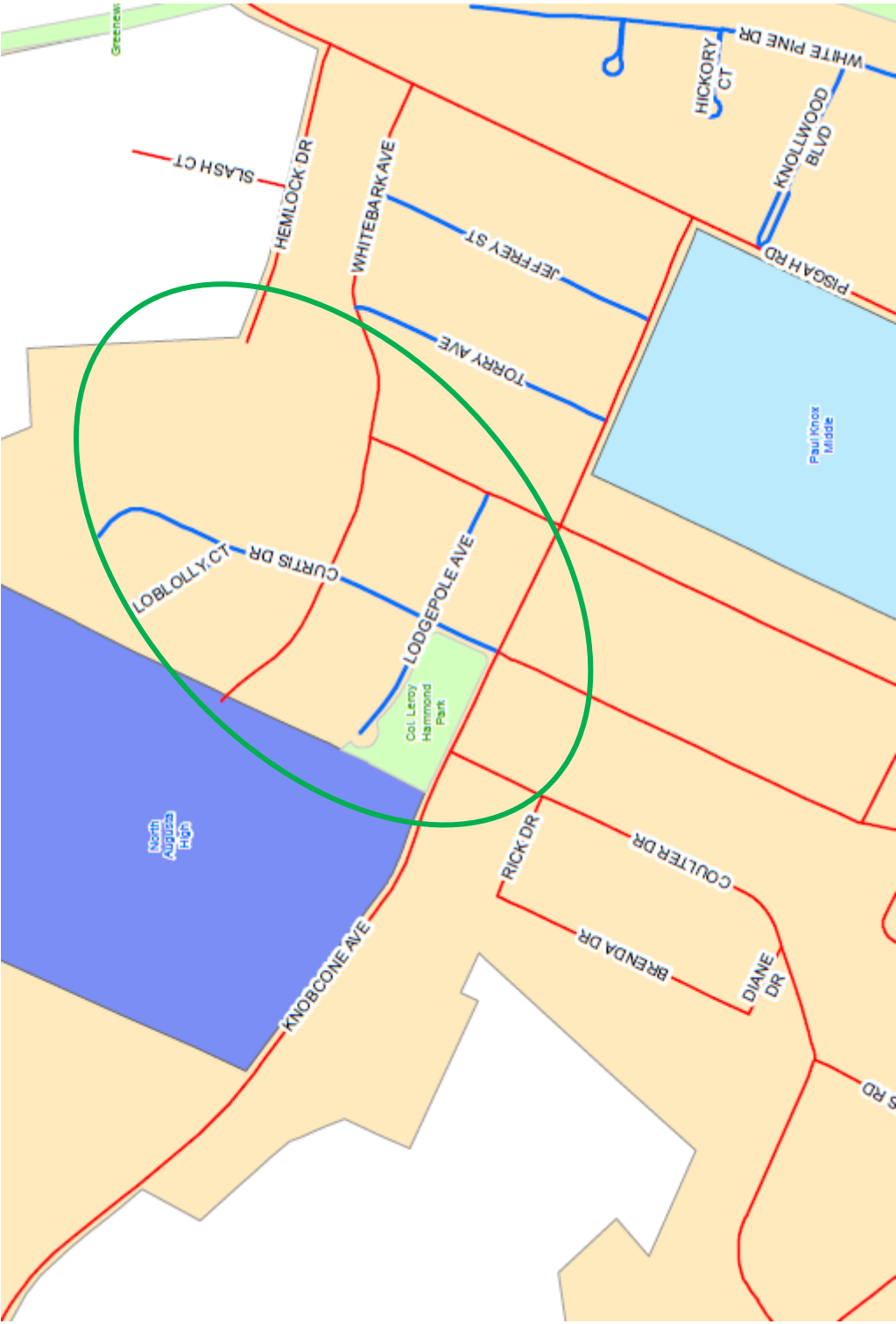

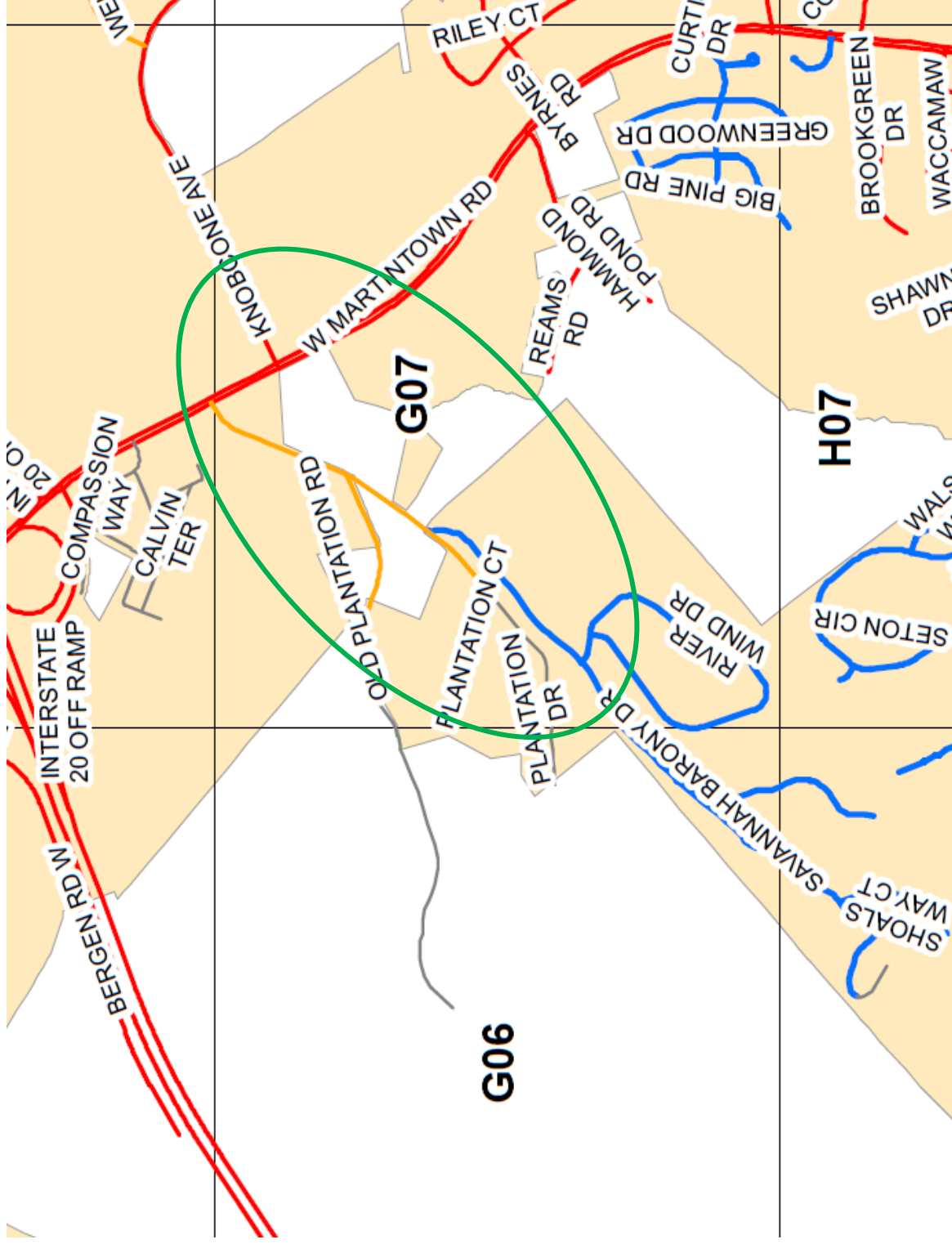

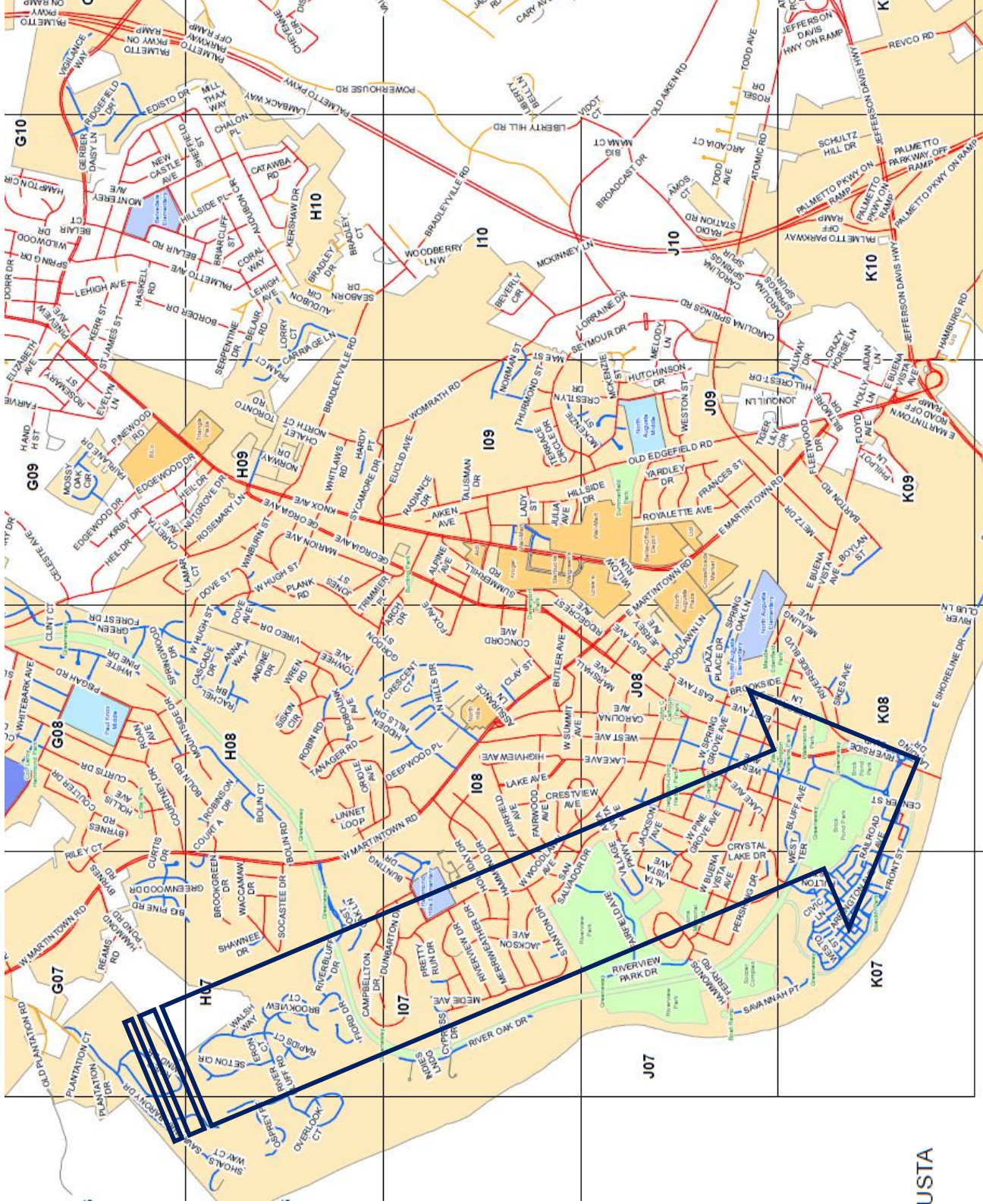


City & County Road Example

 - **Report leaning tree to City Clerk: 803-441-4202**
 - **City Arborist will evaluate the tree**
 - **City will make a determination about removal**
- **Your tree falls onto City property**
 - **City will remove tree from the City property only**
- **City tree falls in your yard, damaging City property**
 - **City will remove tree from City property and repair City property**





Operation End State:

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- **Enable power restoration to 100% of our citizens**
- Road hazards fully identified and removed
- Road debris cleared, all roads to pre-Hurricane status
- Recreational Facilities & City Parks opened to the extent possible
