## Winter Base Sewer Rates Now In Effect

The City of North Augusta uses a system for calculating sewer service charges known as the "Winter Base Sewer Rate System". This system uses three months of water usage to calculate sewer charges for the remaining nine months of the year. While these three months may vary depending on when your water meter is read, they are generally the three individual months as reflected in the water meter readings of: (1) December 10 through January 9; (2) January 10 through February 9; and (3) February 10 through March 9.

The Winter Base System works as follows. The customer is billed a sewer service charge based on actual consumption during each of the three winter base months. The consumption for these months is then averaged. The sewer rate is applied to this average, and the customer's sewer service charge then remains the same for each of the next nine months until the winter base cycle starts again. Customers new to the system with no winter base history are charged an amount equal to an average of all customers.



Water Line Improvements - Construction is nearing completion on the \$475,000 Clay Street to Pisgah Road waterline and pump station project. When completed in early January, this project will more than double the City's upper level water system pumping capacity.


## SPECIAL MONITORING FOR UNREGULATED ORGANIC COMPOUNDS NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF ANALYTICAL RESULTS

1986 Amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act require all public community water supplies to perform special monitoring for the presence of 51 unregulated organic compounds in drinking water. The purpose of this monitoring is to determine the prevalence and magnitude of these compounds in the drinking water supplies in the United States. The S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) is presently performing this monitoring on behalf of public water systems. The results of the first three quarterly monitorings of the City of North Augusta water supply have been received from DHEC and are available for public review.

## FY 89 Municipal Budget Approved

At its regular meeting on December 5, 1988, the North Augusta City Council gave final approval to the 1989 Consolidated Municipal Budget.

The funds and functional areas of expenditures or expenses for the 1989 Consolidated Municipal Budget are shown on the chart on page two.

The General Fund is the main operating fund of the City. It is used to account for all financial resources designated for general government, public safety, public services, and recreation and park expenditures. For the seventh consecutive year, the 1989 General Fund Budget includes no tax increase

Sanitation service charges remain unchanged for 1989. Sanitation and trash services are completely funded by service charges which were last

increased on January 1, 1988.

The charts on page two show the sources of revenues and functional areas of expenditures for the General Fund.

Revenues from the Street Improvement Fund are used for street and storm drainage needs in the City. Planned expenditures in the 1989 budget include light pole replacement at Riverview Park, and storm drainage improvements on East Buena Vista Avenue and in the Summerfield Subdivision.

The Capital Projects Fund is used to account for the financial resources to be used for the acquisition or construction of major capital facilities. The 1989 Capital Projects Fund Budget includes the continuation of a ten mill tax earmarked for major capital projects. The





## Suggested Holiday Safety Tips

The North Augusta Department of Public Safety offers the following safety tips to help you enjoy a safe holiday season:

--Keep matches, lighters and candles out of children's reach.

--Avoid smoking near flammable decorations.

--Make an emergency plan to use if a fire breaks out in the home. See that each family member knows what to do in case of fire.

--Avoid wearing loose, flowing clothes, especially long, open sleeves, near the open flames of a fireplace, stove, or candlelit table.

--Never burn candles near evergreens on a mantlepiece or table. Burning evergreens in the fireplace can be hazardous. When dry, greens burn like tender. Their flames can flare up out of control.

--Remove all wrapping papers from the tree and fireplace areas immediately after presents are opened. Do not burn in fireplace. A flash fire may result, as this paper can ignite suddenly.

--Plan for safety. There is no substitute for common sense. Look for and eliminate potential danger spots near candles, fireplaces, trees and electrical connections.
