# CITY COUNCIL CONSIDERS NEW REVENUE SOURCES

The North Augusta City Council has identified two new sources of revenue available for downtown and riverfront redevelopment. These are the Local Hospitality Tax and the Local Accommodations Tax.

Hospitality Tax: 2% tax on the sales of prepared meals and beverages within the City.

Accommodations Tax: 3% tax on the gross proceeds derived from the rental or charges for overnight stays at motels and bed and breakfast inns.

Council has scheduled public hearings to review with citizens the details of these taxes and the projects for which they will be used.

Public hearings are scheduled for August 17 and September 21 prior to the scheduled first consideration of the ordinance that would adopt the taxes. Public comment periods are also scheduled prior to each of the second and third considerations of the ordinance on October 5 and 19 respectively. The public hearings will be held at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers on the second floor of the Municipal Building.



#### NEW HOME FOR PUBLIC WORKS AND UTILITIES

In March, City Council approved a contract for the construction of a new operations center to house the City's Public Works and Utility Departments. The operations center is being built on eight acres of Cityowned land adjacent to the City's Recycling Center on Clay Pit Road. The Departments of Water and Sewer Operations, Streets and Drains, and Sanitation will be housed in the new center. The center includes office space, vehicle and equipment storage, warehouse space, and a modern maintenance garage. The \$2.2 million center is being jointly funded by the City's General Fund, Sanitation Services Fund and Street Improvements Fund.

With completion of the operations center scheduled for this fall, the old facilities located on East Buena Vista Avenue will be torn down and landscaped to complement the Riverside Boulevard entrance to North Augusta's riverfront. (See #12 on the Project Map on page 7.)

#### GREENEWAY PHASE II OPENS THIS FALL



Phase II of the North Augusta Greeneway is now under construction and will be completed in the fall. This second phase of the popular biking, hiking, jogging, and walking trail from West Martintown Road to Pisgah Road will be 1.5 miles in length. The cost of this section of the trail is \$458,700. Grants have been received from the South Carolina Department of Transportation for \$108,000 and from the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control for \$145,000. The balance of funds is being covered by City-supplied materials, equipment, and labor. When completed, phases I and II of the Greeneway will total 4.8 miles and will be separated only by the roadway of West Martintown Road. The City is currently pursuing funding for a Greeneway trail bridge over West Martintown Road (please see Project Map on page 7).

#### GEORGIA AVENUE STREETSCAPE DESIGN


On July 6, the North August City Council authorized the City's engineering consultant for downtown and riverfront redevelopment, Cranston, Robertson & Whitehurst, P.C., to complete the design for phase I of the downtown streetscape. The downtown streetscape was the first priority of the City Council for the Downtown/Riverfront Redevelopment Program and includes significant improvements in the downtown district. The concept design for the downtown streetscape was completed earlier this year and is available for viewing by the public in the Municipal Building.


Phase I includes all of Georgia Avenue between Jackson Avenue and the Georgia Avenue bridge. Anticipated improvements include new sidewalks, curb and gutter, street pavement, crosswalks, traffic signals, streetlights, landscaping, and street furniture.

Surveyors have already started work on Georgia Avenue. The design will be completed by December, and the construction is anticipated to begin in April, 1999.



#### **BLUE BAGS CHANGED**

Following a successful trial period and in an effort to maintain the best recycling program in the state at the lowest possible costs, the City has introduced a new style of blue bags. These new, bigger bags are made from a lighter and stronger material and use "ears" for tying. Each roll delivered to the customers contains 20 bags, an increase from 13 on the older yellow-tie blue-bag rolls. The City's cost of purchasing these new bags is 25% less. Each bag is identified as property of the City of North Augusta and is to be used only for recycling.

Too Many Blue Bags? If you have received too many blue bags—more bags than you expect to use for recycling—please let the City Sanitation Department know by calling 441-4227. They will be happy to pick up the extras. Remember these bags are not to be used for any other purpose than recycling in the North Augusta recycling program.

Too Few Blue Bags? If you need more blue bags for purposes of recycling, please let the City Sanitation Department know by calling 441-4227 or pick up a roll at the Municipal Building utility payment drive-up window.



#### RECYCLING PROGRAM UPDATE

Citizen commitment to recycling has made North Augusta one of the few communities in South Carolina to reach the goal of 30% recycling. In the past year, the City's Material Recovery Facility removed for recycling 31% of the solid waste collected. Thanks to the participation and support of its citizens, North Augusta's blue-bag program is recognized as

one of the best recycling programs in the State.

The City currently recycles the following material: newspapers, magazines, cardboard, steel cans, scrap metal, aluminum cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic milk jugs, plastic soda bottles, plastic detergent bottles, used motor oil, and batteries.

#### Construction of Riverside Boulevard

#### RIVERSIDE BOULEVARD NEARING COMPLETION

Construction of Riverside Boulevard, the first major public improvement authorized in the Riverfront Redevelopment Program, will be completed in October. The \$1.4 million, six-tenths of a mile boulevard begins at East Buena Vista Avenue near the Municipal Building and ends at a "roundabout" traffic circle near the Savannah River. Riverside Boulevard provides the primary access to riverfront redevelopment projects including the River Club Golf Course, North Augusta Greeneway, River Club single-family subdivision, a future Savannah River hotel site, and more than 150 acres of land available for residential, commercial, and recreational uses.

The Riverside Boulevard alignment combines and widens portions of the old Ponce de Leon Avenue and Detour Road. The new roadway features a center landscaped median, bicycle lanes, and a wide sidewalk that leaves the boulevard and meanders through Waterworks Park. The roundabout termination of Riverside Boulevard provides the intersection with Shoreline Drive that will extend east into the River Club subdivision and west under the Georgia Avenue bridge into the area of the proposed Riverside Park and Churchill Promenade (see #1 on Project Map on page 7).

#### CITY COUNCIL SETS PRIORITIES

Every two years, North Augusta's City Council formally reviews proposed capital construction projects, evaluates new or expanded programs, and establishes priorities for the expenditure of City funds. The Council initiated its 1998 review on March 9 and completed the process on June 1. The City Council priorities guide the City Administration as the annual budgets are developed, departmental programs and projects are prepared, and grants or other outside funding sources are pursued.

The 1998 priorities were separated into two groups for the first time. The first group, Citywide Projects and Programs, will be funded with traditional sources of revenues. The second group, Downtown and Riverfront Redevelopment Projects, will be funded with several special revenue sources. The projects and programs in order of priority are listed in Groups I and II:

#### **CONSTRUCTION**

Currently under construction, www.northaugusta.net, is scheduled to be on line in September. The North Augusta site will include pages devoted to current issues being considered by the City Council, information on the City's history, officials, and budget, and agendas and minutes of City Council, Planning Commission, and other board meetings. Other pages will provide information on parks and recreation activities and schedules and the e-mail addresses of selected City personnel. Also included will be notices of public works and utilities activities that might affect roads and traffic conditions and sanitation schedule updates. In the future, the site will include e-mail links to submit utility and solid waste service requests. The City's website will also contain economic development and public safety information and provide links to a number of related sites. #### City-Wide Projects & Programs

- Greeneway Phase III A pedestrian and bicycle bridge over West Martintown Road to connect phases I and II. (See Project Map # 3).
- 2. First Responder Program A program to equip and train Public Safety officers to respond to medical emergencies and render assistance until an ambulance arrives.
- 3. Lions Field Reconstruction of Lions Field to provide two full-size playing fields, modern rest rooms, concession stands, and adequate handicap access (See Project Map #4).
- 4. Storm Drainage Improvements A program to provide expanded maintenance of the City's stormwater drainage system.
- 5. Public Safety Computer Upgrade Improvements to the Department's computer system including software that will improve operations, prevent a year 2000 problem, and permit integration with national and state crime information centers.
- 6. Creighton Living History Park Improvements A master plan and program of improvements to the park (See Project Map #5).
- 7. Mobile Data Terminals Use of lap-top computers in Public Safety patrol cars providing officers with direct data links to state and national crime information centers. Will enable officers to submit reports directly from the field.
- 8. Summerfield Skateboard Park Design and construction of a skate-boarding facility in Summerfield Park (See Project Map #6).
- 9. Downtown Development Assistance Program A program to encourage downtown businesses and property owners to make property improvements, increase business activity, and revitalize the downtown area.
- 10. Riverview Park Soccer Complex Design and construction of new soccer fields across from the City's water treatment plant. (See Project Map #7).
- 11. Greeneway Phase IV Construction of the Greeneway from Georgia Avenue to a point midway between the Georgia Avenue bridge and the bridge at Fifth Street (See Project Map #3).
- 12. Waterworks Park Improvements Improvements to the park located behind the Municipal Building between Riverside Boulevard and Georgia Avenue (See Project Map #9).
- 13. Greeneway Phase V Extension of the Greeneway from the point where Phase IV ends to the bridge at Fifth Street (See Project Map #10)
- 14. Christmas in the Park An annual festival of Christmas light displays and holiday activities in Riverview Park.



Please help to keep the City beautiful and safe by following a few suggestions:

Yard maintenance. Spring rain and summer heat always bring grass that grows too fast. Lawns should be mowed regularly, and trees and bushes should be pruned when necessary. The City will remove all yard waste on regular trash pickup days if it is placed at the curb.

Inoperable vehicles. Inoperable vehicles parked in the street sometime interfere with emergency vehicles and can become a traffic hazard. Inoperable vehicles should never be parked on the shoulder of a road or in front of a residence. There are several businesses listed in the yellow pages that will purchase and tow inoperable vehicles.

Yard sales. Summer is the season for yard sales. Yard sale signs should be placed in the yard where the sale is taking place. Additionally, directional signs pointing the way to a yard sale may be placed inside the curb at one or two intersections in the vicinity. No sign should be attached to an existing sign post, fence, or utility pole. Signs should not be set up before the morning of the sale and should be taken down as soon as possible after the sale is over


Banners and Balloons. For safety reasons banners, fluttering signs, and balloons are not allowed as signs or for advertising. They can break loose, no matter how well installed, and possibly injure a pedestrian or cause a vehicle accident.
